Judith's story

Rethinking my youth through my new *carte cancer*

In 2016, Judith Lafaille discovered she had an incurable brain tumor. An earth-shattering diagnosis for her who was only 24 years old. While she was completing a specialized post-graduate degree, she suddenly found herself in limbo: she did not have a job, was not receiving any financial support, and was seriously ill.

The physical decline was hard to contend with, maybe even more because Judith was in the prime of her life. She found herself successively mourning a series of small and not-so-small losses... "Accepting that you'll be infertile, being always limited to travel, or just to go out with some friends. Life projects are put on ice and dreams turn to be broken."

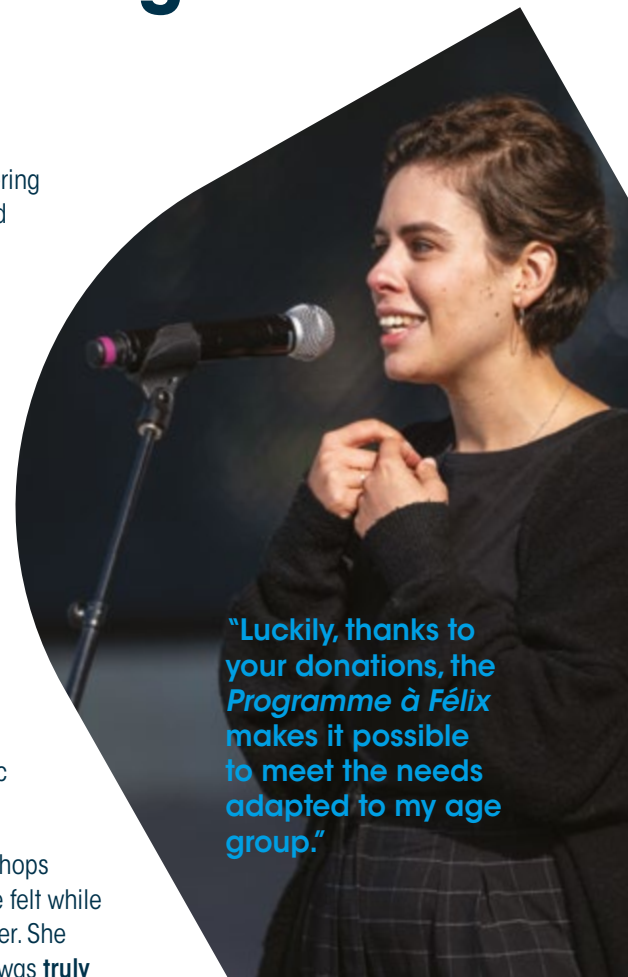
Judith received daily radiotherapy and oral chemotherapy for a short period, followed by a protocol of five oral chemotherapy treatments per month. During one year, she faced treatment side effects that triggered chronic anxiety and depression: water retention, hair loss, anxiety, tiredness, psychological changes, etc. The tumor was stabilized but Judith was exhausted.

Then one day, while she navigated the *Programme à Félix* Web page, a resource for youth aged from 15 to 39 years old living with cancer, she read about the Quebec Cancer Foundation and its complementary therapies and psychological support.

Every week for over a year, Judith took part in the Foundation's free art therapy workshops for young adults. These workshops provided her with an outlet for describing how she felt while also forging new friendships with other young people who were, like her, facing cancer. She lived sharing and relaxing moments, all while receiving support. "For me, art therapy was **truly a lifeline**; a smooth transition to **accepting what my new life would be**."

Judith discovered anew the joy of living, by letting go and appreciating the present moment through meditation and art. Despite her diagnosis, she was feeling an undeniable itch to begin making long-term plans. This led to her becoming a formidable ambassador for *La marche du Grand dévouement* in Montreal in September 2021, and the event's top fundraiser in Quebec, raising \$11,000 for the Foundation.

Today, Judith is doing well and constantly learning new ways of living with cancer while adapting to her daily oral chemotherapy treatments. She continues to support the Foundation and is planning for an exciting future. Thanks to the support received and relationships developed through the Foundation, Judith is now a host for *la carte cancer*, a podcast series at Radio-Canada that shed a humorous and unfiltered light on cancer and its various aspects. Judith is also a co-founder of *la Bande cancéreuse*, an Instagram account offering support to people with cancer through humor, one day at a time.

Together, we are supporting more people across Quebec



2021 proved to be another challenging year for all Quebecers and the rest of the world. At the Foundation, we overcame these challenges by moving forward with our strategic plan, *Being Closer to the People*.

Patience, resilience, and courage were the key words of 2021, a year still largely marked by the pandemic. These defining words also happen to be characteristics and capabilities that persons with cancer and their loves become highly familiar with as they make their way through a minefield strewn with instances of physical, mental and emotional fatigue. At the Foundation, we noticed this fatigue and reacted.

We faced these circumstances by being proactive, which entailed changes that would allow us to better hear, inform, comfort, support, and provide accommodation to yet more Quebecers living with cancer.

2021 was the stage for several novel initiatives impacting the physical and psychological well-being of people impacted by cancer: the roll-out of new service platforms, an optimized management approach, and the mobilization of our team. The year was also marked by the unwavering support and commitment of our Board of Directors. This new team, steeped in gender equity, ethnic and cultural diversity, and varied profiles, arouse a wave of innovation in our recent decision-making and actions.

In addition, our initiatives with new partners have also helped make a significant difference in how people with cancer can benefit from an improved quality of life. We have also increasingly spoken up on behalf of Quebecers with cancer on their rights and access to healthcare, and raised awareness to our programs and services with 350 media mentions at a national level, among others.

Case in point, our Info-cancer Services were once again in great demand, with over 3,165 requests for support. To achieve our objective of being more accessible, we recruited yet more resources to man our telephone peer matching service, which has experienced a 14% surge in demand. Lastly, we witnessed an increase of 66% in the demand for our psychological support services.

Given the strong interest in our virtual group workshops, we multiplied the complementary therapies offered online. The number of virtual and in-person participations went from over 5,000 in 2020 to nearly 9,000 in 2021.

The demand for information and resources by patients, family members, and health care professionals remained high. The number of visitors to our online Resources directory more than doubled in a single year, which points to the relevance and ensure ongoing access to over 2,200 oncology resources across Quebec.

In order to improve access to healthcare services, we opened what is now the largest Lodge in our network, an 81-bed accommodation Centre in Quebec City. This resource is a ray of hope for the numerous people receiving cancer treatments who live in remote regions such as Saguenay and Côte-Nord.

This year was a remarkable one, also due to our incredible and strong partnerships. We reach and even surpass our objectives, thanks to the unwavering support of a growing number of donors, sponsors, and partners. And lest we forget, your ongoing support at fundraising activities such as *Cancerto* benefit events and *La marche du Grand dévouement* in every region of Quebec were key to raising record amounts.

On behalf of everyone living with cancer and their loved ones, thank you! With you at the heart of our actions, the Quebec Cancer Foundation continues to ensure that no Quebecer need ever face cancer alone.

Breaking news: in 2022, we will pursue this desire to improve the quality of life and access to healthcare for all Quebecers with cancer and their loved ones, by launching a \$1 million financial support program. This would not even be possible without your support.

We want to thank the members of the Board of Directors for their support and trust over the year, as well as the numerous Foundation employees and volunteers.

Closer to Quebecers across the province



The largest Lodge of our accommodation network in Quebec

On November 15, 2021, we had the pleasure of welcoming the first guests to our sixth Lodge in the heart of Quebec City. Boasting 48 rooms and 81 beds, this Lodge is the largest facility in our network. It takes us one step closer to reaching our objective of being increasingly present across the province to support yet more Quebecers with cancer and their loved ones. Guests of our Lodges, who often live in remote regions, can benefit from affordable accommodations close to the hospital centers where they receive oncology treatments. Our approach to facilitating the lives of our beneficiaries and their loved ones is focused on humanism, mutual aid, support, complementary therapies, and psychological support.

Successful partnerships for the well-being of people with cancer

Thanks to an approach focused on the overall well-being of all Quebecers facing cancer and fueled by our objective of providing them with much-needed support, we pursued building various partnerships across the province. This year, we were pleased to announce our partnership with Colorectal Cancer Canada, the Brain Tumour Foundation of Canada, and the Lymphedema Association of Québec.

Our new partnership with MOVE 50+ — a digital platform featuring videos of physical exercises for people aged 50 or more — also supports better health for people with cancer after having been evaluated by one of our kinesiologists.

Our partnership with OmbudService for Life and Health Insurance allowed optimization of the daily well-being and financial security of people with cancer and their loved ones. This free and bilingual service for settling personal insurance disputes will help the Foundation beneficiaries and their loved ones access assistance and obtain information on dispute resolution in insurance matters.

Service growth and accessibility of our services

While our desire to be increasingly accessible for Quebecers impacted by cancer has always been a key goal, the pandemic represented an opportunity to accelerate the digital shift of our services.

To meet the growing demand for our online art therapy workshops and kinesiology, yoga, and Qi Gong sessions, we increased the weekly frequency of these services. In 2021, we registered over 5,000 individual participations. We also counted close to 3,200 interventions via our Info-cancer Services. These constantly rising numbers attest to the popularity of and growing demand for the Foundation’s services.

In light of this staggering interest and to increase our support, we offered online art therapy workshops to the loved ones also.

We enhanced our kinesiology services through new partnerships with Ékisanté, Kinik, and Pavillon Beauce-Etchemin to reach more Quebecers in their home regions.

1st collective virtual forum on the important role played by support in the trajectory of oncology

On June 16th, the Quebec Cancer Foundation joined forces with Leucan, the Canadian Cancer Society, the Cancer Research Society and PROCURE to present the first virtual forum *Unis pour les personnes atteintes du cancer et leurs proches* (Together in support of people with cancer and their loved ones). In attendance of Mr. Christian Dubé, Minister of Health and Social Services, this first-of-its-kind event was an unbelievable opportunity to highlight the importance of our organizations throughout the cancer trajectory. Hundreds of patients, families, healthcare providers, and health and social services managers participated virtually to discuss the need to further exchange and collaborate with the Government of Quebec to better support yet more Quebecers impacted by cancer.

Annie and Marie-Claude's story

Two mothers bound by friendship and cancer



In 2013, I became friends with Annie, one of my co-workers; we particularly enjoyed doing sports activities together. In 2020, while I was on maternity leave, Annie discovered she had cancer. I was devastated and couldn't stop wondering how this disease could strike my friend, an active woman so filled with life and so young.

A few months later, I found myself in her shoes: I was also diagnosed with cancer. Digesting all of the information associated with my diagnosis, caring for my baby while undergoing therapy, or even performing daily tasks was extremely challenging. I also received the news that I would no longer be able to have children; a second shock for me since I was only in my thirties. I felt like time had suddenly come to a standstill.

In a reversal of roles, Annie, who was recovering, was there to support me. Together we could speak of our deepest emotions and experiences about cancer and tried to change our minds as much as possible. At the onset of my therapy, I felt I could benefit from further support.

There was nothing easy about juggling cancer and motherhood.

I eventually found the support I was looking for in the various programs and services of the Quebec Cancer Foundation. I benefited from kinesiology and massage therapy sessions* at the Gatineau Regional Center. These resources, free of charge or at a reasonable cost, were ways of forgetting my cancer for a few hours — hours during which I felt just like “any other” woman or mother.

Massage therapy eased my physical pain but also helped to release my emotions, dissipate my anxiety, and gave my body much-needed relief from cancer and its treatments. I excitedly shared this discovery with Annie, so that she could also benefit from this gentle caress for the body but also the mind and soul. On the massage table, we found a sort of goodness that enveloped our bodies, wrapping us in layers of love and healing. These sessions were extremely beneficial during those trying times.



A few months later, the Foundation organized its annual province-wide event: *La marche du Grand dévouement* of 2021. We were determined to participate in this movement of solidarity that enables the Foundation to keep offering its valuable services. Taking part in this event was a way of remembering the progress we had made and celebrating the end of our therapy and the resumption of other physical activities with our loved ones. We wanted to celebrate health! It was the perfect occasion to raise funds for the Foundation that had given us so much. Annie and I still feel compelled to roll up our sleeves and help the thousands of Quebecers facing cancer benefit from the services and psychological support of the Foundation and the kindness of its team.

Together, we went through our treatments and dealt with this challenge. Our friendship is now bound by the inexplicable respect for each other and each person who has or has had cancer. This is why **we supported the Foundation and continue to do so today**; it is a way of **paying it forward** so that others also can benefit from its positive impact.

La marche du Grand défolement

La marche du Grand défolement, presented by Desjardins, has beaten records with total funds raised of over \$426,000 during its 4th edition, and over \$1 million since the event was first held in 2018. Urged to participate in the event by Quebec Prime Minister François Legault, Quebecers stepped up to join this wave of solidarity. From September 11th to October 3rd, 1,150 people (representing 171 teams) gathered in Montreal, Quebec City, Gatineau, Granby, and Trois-Rivières parks to walk together, hail the courage of people with cancer, and collect funds. Residents of Laval and Rimouski joined the movement by walking in their neighbourhoods thanks to our partnerships with the Fondation Maxime-Letendre and the Association du Cancer de l'Est du Québec. Overall, 4,550 people participated in this fundraising event.

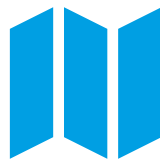

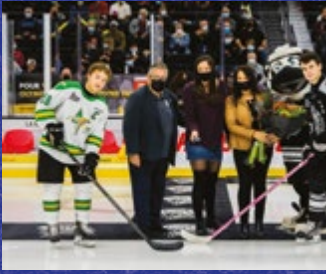

Cancerto

If the restrictions imposed by the pandemic have forced us to offer a new 100% online format in 2020, we have been delighted to come back and find the warmth of theaters for the *Cancerto* benefit events in 2021. Once again, the business community was present to bring its support to the Quebec Cancer Foundation. From October to December, music legends such as the Orchestre du Septième Art, Guylaine Tanguay, Mario Pelchat, Dan Bigras, and Eli Woods performed in Quebec City, Gatineau, Sherbrooke, and Montreal to offer enchanting and mobilizing shows and help yet more Quebecers impacted by cancer. Also available online, over 1,500 people attended the concerts, either in person or in the comfort of their own homes.

The last event of the Cancerto series was held in Montreal on December 7, 2021. With Foundation General Manager Marco Décelles at her side, Guylaine Tanguay, our spokesperson, unveiled the total amount raised during this province-wide corporate campaign: an impressive \$1,005,817.

These funds enable thousands of people rendered more vulnerable by cancer to access services and programs designed to improve their well-being.

Bubbles for hope

On December 2, 2021, 70 guests from the Lanaudière business community attended the region’s 5th prestige champagne tasting event, organized by campaign president Ms. Diane Moreau, Mr. John Stimpson from Cryos Technologies, Mr. Emmanuel Préville-Ratelle from the law firm of Ratelle Ratelle et Associés, and Mr. Evens Landreville-Nadeau from Transport Gaston Nadeau. Gathered around a feast of delicacies at the Musée d’art de Joliette, guests enjoyed an auction to raise funds for the Foundation. A total of \$51,575 was raised to help people impacted by cancer.



Le Grand fou rire

In 2021, the Quebec Cancer Foundation came up with a novel idea for a new event: *Le Grand fou rire*. On the occasion of Global Wellness Day, on June 12th, 4,025 participants across Quebec gathered virtually to stock up on happy hormones by laughing with the event’s host, renowned Montreal drag queen Rita Baga, and Claude Couture, a Hasyayoga (laughter yoga) coach and facilitator of the Laughter Yoga workshops (*Rire, c’est la santé*) offered by the Foundation since a few years. The positive impacts of laughter on physical, emotional, and social health, especially for people with cancer, have been proven beyond a shadow of a doubt. *Le Grand fou rire* was an opportunity to share the benefits of this delirium of joy across the province while also supporting Quebecers with a cancer diagnosis.

Our partners in action

Fondation J.A. DeSève

Long-time partner Fondation J.A. DeSève, and Governor Member since 2018, reinforced its support to the Foundation in 2021. Thanks to the generous donation of \$80,000, hundreds of Foundation beneficiaries will have access to an affordable stay, including all meals, at one of our six Lodges in Québec. To date, Fondation J.A. DeSève has donated \$1.28 million to the Quebec Cancer Foundation.

The unwavering support of UAP

A top-tier ally, UAP (NAPA Auto Parts) has consistently offered its support to the Foundation. After gathering funds from its employees through a payroll deduction program, the company partnered with our matching donations campaign in 2018. 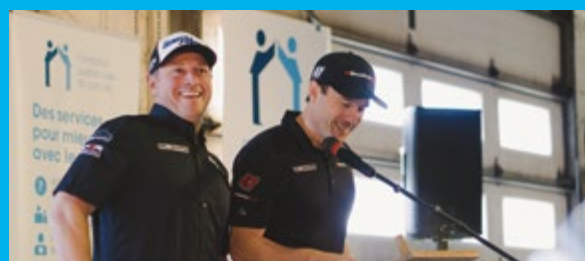
MERCK in support of peer matching
